

Laura Braso Soprano





Laura Brasó, born in Barcelona in 1996, had her first contact with music at an early age through the piano, viola and choral singing. At the age of 14, she began her singing studies with the mezzo-soprano Francesca Roig. A few years later she continued her training at Liceu, Superior Music Conservatory in Barcelona.

During these years she has had the opportunity to take singing classes with prominent artists such as the soprano Nelly Miricioiu, the conductor and composer Miquel Ortega, the soprano Mariella Devia, the baritone Carlos Álvarez or the tenor Jaume Aragall among others.

The young soprano has been awarded several times by the Mirna Lacambra Competition to participate in her Opera School. In 2019 she won First Prize at the XV Les Corts International Music Competition, as well as several prizes at the VI Tenerife Opera Singing Competition. In 2021 she was a finalist in the XXXVIII Logroño Singing Contest where she won extraordinary prizes. In his most recent career, she has been a finalist in the 59th Viñas International Tenor Singing Competition, where she also won 5 extraordinary prizes.

Her operatic debut was in 2015 with the role of Frasquita in Carmen by Bizet, a role that she played again years later at the Teatro de la Maestranza in Seville. Other performances include the roles of Cherubino in Le Nozze di Figaro and Zerlina in Don Giovanni. Her upcoming engagements include Nella in Gianni Schicchi and Liu in Turandot.
